

UAE to host annual Global South-South Development Expo 2016

Ever since the countries of the "global South" took the bold decision to lean on each other in order to advance their economic growth and development, new models of development cooperation, based on mutual benefit and solidarity, have come into play. Today, South-South cooperation has the potential to facilitate sustainable development while balancing growth with equity, as outlined in the 2012 United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development.

The UAE too believes in the strength of global partnerships to turn climate challenges into opportunities to build a more diversified and sustainable economy. The development programmes initiated by HH Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, have been providing assistance in the form of investments, debt-relief, infrastructure building, technical cooperation and experimentation in new technologies and products to countries in Africa and the Far East.

Through Dubai Cares, Noor Dubai and UAE Water Aid Foundation (Suqia) amongst a host of others, the UAE is also developing other sectors that are essential for improving human life

By hosting the GSSD Expo, the nation is reiterating its commitment to the UAE Vision 2021. It is my sincere hope that the GSSD Expo 2016 will serve as a dedicated forum to enhancing regional capacities through continued interaction and knowledge sharing and we look forward to welcoming you all at the event.

Heads of states and governments, ministers, business leaders and experts will spotlight Southern-grown solutions and cooperation opportunities toward attaining the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

he Zayed International Foundation for the Environment is all set to host the eighth annual Global South-South Development Expo (GSSD Expo) on behalf of the Government of UAE from October 31 to November 3, 2016 in Dubai.

Held under the theme 'South-South 20 UN agencies and partners. Cooperation: Towards innovation and roadmap for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the GSSD Expo aims to engage all development sectors, including the private sector and civil society, to scale up concrete southerngrown initiatives to help achieve

the goals of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The Global South-South Development Expo will be organised by the United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation (UNOSSC) in conjunction with more than An agreement to this effect was signed earlier this year on 4th April by Prof. Dr. Mohamed Ahmed Bin Fahad, Chairman of the Higher Committee, Zayed International Foundation for the Environment and Mr. Jorge Chediek, Envoy of the United

Nations Secretary-General on South-South Cooperation and Director, UN Office for South-South Cooperation. The agreement was signed in the presence of high level dignitaries from both the institutions at a press conference held at the Dubai Police Academy.

South-South cooperation is a broad framework for collaboration among countries of the South in the political, economic, social, cultural, environmental and technical domains.

Building on past successes and driven by the strong desire of



the international community to continue to share and exchange South-South development solutions, the GSSD Expo 2016 will be hosted by the Government of the United Arab Emirates. through the Zayed International Foundation for the Environment.

This year's Expo will resonate the collective demand of the peoples of the global South to systematically present various models, approaches and tools in South-South cooperation and triangular cooperation that will help the global South realize its shared aspirations for achieving sustainable and equitable development through the sharing and transfer of Southern homegrown development solutions.

"We are now building it up on a national level. The South South Expo is not to be seen as a mere conference; it exemplifies the UAE Vision 2021 wherein the Government wants to ensure sustainable development while



preserving the environment, and to achieve a perfect balance between economic and social development."

Bin Fahd said the expo will address eight main themes in relation to sustainable development: poverty eradication, food security, public private partnerships, green technology transfer, economic growth, industrial innovation, green economies, and global health. He added, "Without leadership there can be no sustainable development. Our events since our inception in 1999 work on establishing the principle of wise leadership to achieve sustainable development."

In his address, Mr. Jorge Chediek

said the 2016 Global South-South Development Expo would be the first expo to be hosted by a country, as they have been until now hosted by UN entities.

"The UAE is an excellent example of a developing country that has distinctly proven its achievement in sustainability and therefore I am happy to have this event here. Sustainable development is not an abstract concept; it is a reality and a better way of developing a country."

He added: "The UAE is also a model of tolerance and of how different cultures and religion could work together. These are the values enshrined in the UN and hence, there could be no better place than the UAE to host

the event. The 2016 Global South-South Development Expo also will be an excellent opportunity to showcase to other countries the success the UAE has achieved in the field of sustainable development."

In his concluding remarks, Mr. Jorge Chediek thanked the Zayed International Foundation for the Environment and the UAE for hosting the event and setting an example to the world.

The theme of the GSSD Expo 2016 is in line with the UAE's National Strategy of Innovation that aims to make the UAE among the most innovative nations in the world by 2020.

he eighth annual 2016 Global South-South Development Expo, to be hosted by the Zayed International Foundation for the Environment on behalf of the Government of UAE from October 31 to November 3, 2016 in Dubai will be held under the theme 'South-South Cooperation: Towards innovation and roadmap for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development'.

Incidentally, the UAE was ranked first among Arab countries and 41st worldwide in the Global Innovation Index that was announced recently in August at the UN headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland.


The UAE improved its position in the international innovation ranking report that saw it move up from second in the Arab world and 47th globally last year.

Revealing the details of the report, Sultan Al Mansouri, Minister of Economy, had noted that "Innovation is a major pillar of the country's economic development and at the heart of good government policies aimed at placing the UAE among the top 10 countries on the index."

He added that while many countries are cutting spending on research and development, the UAE is still putting major effort towards innovation. He estimated the percentage contribution of knowledge and innovation to the gross domestic product at about 3 per cent, which he said was one of the highest rates worldwide.

The UAE had marked 2015 as the Year of Innovation on the directives of President His Highness Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Al Nahyan.

Making this announcement in November 2014, the President said: "Today we live in a rapidly

changing world, with speedy developments, great opportunities, discoveries and inventions. Hence we must prepare our generations in a manner commensurate with the world in which we live, and ensure us a place among other nations, thus guaranteeing us a bright future and private sectors to explore new such as our present day."

On the occasion, His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum. Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, stated: "Today, more remarked that the UAE has than ever, we need to stimulate the spirit of innovation in our youth, and establish environments

that encourage innovation in our communities, universities and schools. We need to establish methodologies for research, investigation, and exploration in our new generations and we need to urge and push our government areas for the development of our economy."

Last year, at the opening of the world's first 3D printed office in Dubai. HH Sheikh Mohammed emerged as one of the major incubators of innovation and future technology in the world today, and

its focused initiatives to shape the future have become global models that can be emulated in all sectors.

In 2014, HH Sheikh Mohammed bin. Rashid. had launched a National Innovation Strategy that aims to make the UAE among the most innovative nations in the world by the year 2020. The strategy seeks to stimulate innovation in seven sectors including renewable energy, transport, education, health, technology, water and space.

The first phase includes 30 national initiatives to be completed within three years.

Intensive preparations ahead of GSSD Expo 2016

ver since the signing of an agreement earlier this year on 4th April by Prof. Dr. Mohammed Ahmed Bin Fahad, Chairman of the Higher Committee, Zayed International Foundation for the Environment and Mr. Jorge Chediek, Envoy of the United Nations Secretary-General on South-South Cooperation and Director, UN Office for South-South Cooperation for the hosting of the eighth annual Global South-South Development Expo by the Zayed Foundation on behalf of the government of the UAE, there has been a flurry of activity in the run up to the event set to commence on Prize for the Environment;

October 31st in Dubai.

Following the signing of the agreement, Dr. Mohammed Ahmed bin Fahad, headed a meeting of Higher Committee members of the Zayed Foundation to discuss both organizational and logistical operations of hosting the Global South-South Development Expo 2016.

Abdellatif, Chief Technical Advisor of the Zayed Foundation.

At the outset of the meeting, Dr. Mohammad bin Fahad welcomed new members of the Higher Committee including Mrs. Maryam Saeed Hareb from the Ministry of Climate Change and Environment, Alia Abdel Rahim Al Harmoudi.

Speaking about the vision of the Founding Father of the UAE, Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan in pursuing development that meets the needs of present and future generations, Dr. Bin Fahad said that the wise leader had infused in the UAE a spirit of responsibility and collaboration to ensure the sustainable development of the UAE. The Rio Summit's Principle 10 adheres to this same view, he added, which states that

"environmental issues are best handled with participation of all concerned citizens, at the relevant level." The Zayed Foundation is proud to host a major event such as the Global South-South Development Expo 2016, he noted, adding that it would be held in tandem with the launch of the third cycle of the Emirates Appreciation Award for the Environment.

Participation at the fifth biennial High-level Meeting of the Development Cooperation Forum (DCF)

As host of the 2016 GSSD Expo, the Zayed International Foundation

for the Environment was invited in July 2016 to participate at the fifth biennial High-level Meeting of the Development Cooperation Forum (DCF) held at the United Nations Headquarters in New York as part of the High-level Segment of the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC).

Representing the Zayed Foundation at the event was Dr. Meshgan Al Awar, Secretary General, who was also invited to deliver a keynote address prior to the panel discussion on "Development cooperation perspectives on capacity-building and the role of





technology development and facilitation in implementing the Sustainable Development Goals".

Chaired by Sven Jürgenson (Estonia), Vice-President of the Economic and Social Council, the panel discussion was moderated by Elliott Harris, Assistant Secretary-General and Director of the New York Office of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP).

Dr. Meshgan Al Awar began her keynote address by expressing her gratitude to the ECOSOC President and the DCF organizers for the invitation to the fifth biennial High-level Meeting of the Development Cooperation Forum.

She said that the UAE was both

a developing country and a major donor, and has been recognized as one of the two largest donors worldwide for the last three years, with the highest Official Development Assistance/Gross National Income ratio.

"Our experience reinforces for us how critical development cooperation is for the 2030 Agenda – and how much we have to gain from each other, especially through joint innovation," she said.

In October 2016, on behalf of the government of the UAE, the Zayed International Foundation for the Environment would be hosting the 2016 Global South-South Development Expo to highlight concrete initiatives that could be replicated elsewhere, she said.

"The Global South-South Development Expo - the first Expo following the adoption of Agenda 2030 - will focus on what has been a defining feature for the UAE's own development: capacity-building and innovation," she said, "and will be held under the theme 'South-South Cooperation: Towards Enhancing Innovations for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development."

Discussion of organizational and logistical operations

The Zayed International Foundation for the Environment held a meeting of its Higher Committee members in August at the Dubai World Trade Centre to discuss several organizational and related aspects related to the hosting of the GSSD Expo 2016.

The Global South-South Development Expo is the world's biggest stage for development solutions created in the South for the South.


Agenda for Youth will be launched at the GSSD Expo 2016.



Former US President Jimmy Carter became the first recipient of the Zayed International Prize for the Environment in the Global Leadership category. At the first cycle of the awards ceremony held on April 22, HH Sheikh Mohammed also jointly awarded Prof. Mohamed El-Kassas (Egypt) and the World Commission on Dams in the Scientific & Technological Achievements category; and Ms. Yolanda Kakabadse (Ecuador) and Stephan Schmidheiny (Switzerland) in the category for Environmental Action with Positive Impact on Society.

Zayed Prize hosted the **Dubai International Conference on Integrated Management of Water Resources in the Third Millennium**, in collaboration with the Global Water Council. It issued the 'Dubai Declaration on Integrated Water Resources Management in Arid Regions' which was printed, distributed widely among countries of Arid Regions and adopted by the UNEP and was included in the UN Secretary General's speech at the Johannesburg Summit of 2002.

Researches filed were published in a book by the International Printing House of Elsevier. This conference was accompanied by a number of specialized workshops and a comprehensive Exhibition on Environmentally Sustainable Technology related to Water Conservation and Distillation as well as finding alternatives for the same in cooperation with Dubai Electricity and Water Authority (DEWA).

At the **World Summit on Sustainable Development in Johannesburg**, South Africa in September, the Zayed International Prize for the Environment called for strengthening international efforts on water resources in arid regions.

The conference issued the 'Dubai Declaration on Trans-boundary Air Pollution'. The conference recommended the establishment of a 'Regional Center in the UAE for the monitoring of Trans-boundary Air Pollution'.

Events of the conference included a debate arena for the upcoming generations entitled 'Students Parliament', in which 40 high school students from 12 different schools in the UAE debated the issue of air pollution and methods for handling such problems.



The second cycle of the Zayed Prize Award ceremony was held at the Dubai International Convention Center, the Dubai World Trade Center on February 24. British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC), UK was awarded in the Global Leadership category in recognition of the "distinctive leadership influencing international, regional and local policies, concepts and media and education programmes in environment and sustainable development fields."

The jury said the Corporation's TV, radio and internet journalism had put policymakers on the spot, forcing them to justify their positions.











The prize for the Scientific & Technological Achievements category was shared by the three professors who worked together to establish and activate the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC). These include: Prof. Godwin Obasi (Nigeria), Prof. Mostafa Tolba (Egypt) and Prof. Bert Bolin (Sweden).

For demonstrating the importance of the role of NGOs and the civil society in advancing the global environmental agenda, Dr. Badria Al Awadhi (Kuwait) and Prof. Jamal Mohamed Safi (Palestine) were honored in the category of Environmental Action with Positive Impact on Society.

Secretary General, was awarded the Zayed International Prize for the Environment at the third cycle of the awards in February in tandem with the opening of the 9th Special Session of the UNEP Governing Council and the International Forum of Environment Ministers. This is a milestone event in the history of the UNEP Governing Council as it is the first time the event is held in the Middle East. The Global Ministerial Environment Forum issued the 'UAE initiative for achieving sustainable development' which includes important recommendations on all sustainability issues, especially those related to chemicals, energy and tourism.

In their citation, the International Jury said that "one person has done more than most to catalyze political and public opinion to an understanding that the environment is a fundamental pillar of sustainable development - that person is Mr. Kofi Annan."

"Five years ago, recognizing the potential threat that environmental degradation posed for people around the world, Mr. Annan also called for the first-ever













international scientific assessment of the health of the world's ecosystems," said the citation.

The other winners in the third cycle include Millennium Ecosystem Assessment in the Scientific & Technological Achievements category which is the work of 1,360 experts from 95 countries, and according to the Jury is a "landmark study on the condition of the world's ecosystem services from fisheries and freshwaters up to the carbon capture of the world's forests".

Angela Cropper (Trinidad and Tobago) and Prof. Emil Salim (Indonesia) were the winners in the category for Environmental Action with Positive Impact on Society.

The Award Ceremony was attended by two Heads of States and the UN Secretary General.



UNEP signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Zayed Prize on June 7 at the UNEP headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya in recognition of the organization's role in raising awareness and visibility about environmental issues within the UAE, the Middle East region and at the international level as well as honoring the valuable cooperation developed over the years with the UN body. The MoU seeks to continue this fruitful partnership as well as pursue the regional implementation of the programme of work of the UNEP.















Zayed International Prize for the Environment hosted the **Dubai International Conference** on Sustainable Construction at the Dubai Police Academy. An exhibition featuring Technologies and Eco-Friendly Construction Materials, was held alongside in collaboration with the Ministry of Environment and Water and UNEP. This conference came in response to the resolution issued by H.H. Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, on the 24th of October, 2007 regarding the implementation of the 'Green Buildings' standards on all buildings and establishments in Dubai as of January 2008.



Over 500 delegates including ministers and officials from the ministries of environment, scientists as well as public and private sector representatives around the world attended the conference held on 8th of June 2008.

The conference came out with comprehensive recommendations about the best techniques, policies and measures to ease the implementation and the spread of the sustainability of green buildings at the local, regional, and international levels.



The fourth cycle of the Zayed International Prize for the Environment was held on 9th June.

Dr. Gro Harlem Brundtland of Norway won the Zayed Prize for Global Leadership in environment. A Norwegian politician, diplomat and physician and an international leader in sustainable development and public health, Dr. Brundtland is a former Prime Minister of Norway and has served as the Director General of the World Health Organization.

Professors Jane Lubchenco from the United States of America and V. Ramanathan from India shared the Zayed Prize for Scientific and Technological Achievements in Environment.













A world leader in environmental sciences, Prof. Jane Lubchenco discovered fundamental ecological and evolutionary relationships among animals and plants in complex coastal systems while Prof. V. Ramanathan is among the most distinguished climatologists in the world. He identified the famous chlorofluorocarbons, stratospheric ozone and other pollutants as significant factors in the anthropogenic greenhouse effect (manmade factors leading to global warming).

The Zayed Prize for Environmental Action Leading to Positive Change in Society was awarded to two Non-Governmental Organizations. The two NGOs are Environment Development Action in the Third World (ENDA) in Senegal and Tierramrica in Latin America.





Zayed Prize hosted the **First Consultation Meeting for the Contaminated Sites Toolkit** in partnership with UNIDO in Dubai in December. Expert participants, drawn from a global set of research institutions, brought in their experiences from different parts of the world to enrich the toolkit and provide the best starting approach to be adopted for building the capacities, institutional and human resources, in the developing countries.



At the event, H.E. Dr. Rashid Ahmed Bin Fahad, UAE Minister of Environment and Water, addressed the meeting of the experts and expressed support to the efforts on remediation of contaminated sites in relation to POPs. The Minister explained that the UAE is a leading country in environmental protection in the region and promised to do his utmost help to facilitate the work of the experts and UNIDO.

Zayed Prize, along with other officials of the Ministry of Environment and Water, UAE, attended the 25th session of the Governing Council/ Global Ministerial Environment Forum (GC/GMEF) of UNEP in February at the UNEP headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya.







Zayed International Prize for the Environment signed an agreement with Italy's Willy Brandt Foundation (FWB) on 19th January to plan and implement initiatives for capacity building of the Gulf Region in the areas of environmental education, training and awareness raising, especially for youth and children.

The Zayed International Prize for the Environment confirmed interest in partnership, collaboration and participation in the initiatives suggested by the FWB in reference to sustainable development activities, energy efficiency, bioclimatic initiatives and other actions that aim at the realisation of the UN's Millennium Development Goals.



On an invitation from the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation (UNIDO), Zayed International Prize for the Environment participated in the fourth Consultation Meeting of the BAT/BEP Forum for the GCC Region held on 21 October in Kuwait. Zayed Prize was represented by the Secretary General, Dr. Meshgan Al Awar, and Chief Technical Advisor, Dr. Eisa Abdellatif.













His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, and Patron of the Zayed International Prize for the Environment, launched at the Dubai Police Academy a new initiative of Dubai Police General Head Quarters to **plant one million trees** in Dubai. He launched the campaign on 10 November by planting the first tree at the main square on the western side of the Dubai Police Academy after unveiling a commemorative plaque for the initiative.

Also present at the launch were Lt. General H.H. Sheikh Saif bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Interior, H.H. Sheikh Majid bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Chairman of Dubai Culture and Arts Authority, H.E. Dr. Rashid Ahmed Bin Fahad, Minister of Environment and Water, Lt. Republic of Korea's development path into a low carbon, resource efficient and Green Economy.

Other winners of the fifth cycle included Sir Partha Dasgupta, a leading economist who made the link between sustainability and economics well before such work was fully understood. He was awarded the Zayed Prize for Scientific and Technological Achievements in Environment.

Dr. Mathis Wackernagel, co-founder of the Global Footprint Network (GFN) and Prof. Najib Saab from Lebanon who founded the groundbreaking and highly successful *Al-Bia Wal-Tanmia* (Environment and Development) magazine in 1996, shared the Zayed Prize for Environmental action leading to positive change in society.











In June, Zayed Foundation, in collaboration with UNIDO launched the 'Contaminated Sites Management Toolkit for Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs)', an environmental document for the global management of sites contaminated with chemicals and organic pollutants which is of extreme importance and relevance to the Arab world, West Asia and developing countries in general.

This toolkit seeks to aid developing countries with the detection, cataloging and prioritisation of contaminated sites. It will assist countries with the development of suitable technologies for land remediation – that is the clean-up of chemical and pollutants on land sites that causes health concerns to humans and the environment in accordance with best available techniques and best environmental practices.

Zayed Prize contributed to a vital international document by its active participation in the **Second Consultation Meeting for the new POPs Guidance** in September at Bangkok, Thailand where it was decided to provide a set of guidance documents that would enable Parties to develop, review and update their National Implementation Plans with the information relating to the nine new POPs added to the Stockholm Convention.







In line with the directives of HH Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum and in collaboration with the Higher Committee of the Zayed International Foundation for the Environment, the UAE Minister of Environment and Water Dr. Rashid Ahmad bin Fahd announced the launch of the Dhs 1 million Emirates Appreciation Award for the Environment.

Designed to promote the values of sustainable development and innovation among the local community, the award seeks to recognize outstanding achievements in the field of environment and energy conservation across all sectors of society.







Zayed Prize attended 12th Special Session of UNEP Governing Council/ Global Ministerial **Environment** Forum from 20-22 February in Nairobi as a member of the official delegation of the UAE. The event served as a highlevel intergovernmental milestone in the intense preparatory process for the upcoming Rio+20, and coincided with the 40th anniversary of UNEP.

From protecting Bluefin Tuna to saving the world's wetlands and championing sustainable development causes, Zayed International Prize for the Environment honors top environmentalists in its 6th cycle of the prestigious awards.

he names of the winners of the 6th cycle of the Zayed International Prize for the Environment, the biggest environmental award on the international arena, was announced on February 1, 2014, by the U.A.E. Minister of Environment and Water, Dr. Rashid Ahmed bin Fahad, at a press conference held in Dubai. His Serene Highness Prince Albert II of Monaco has been named the global winner of the prestigious Zayed International Prize for the Environment.

A renowned conservationist and

advocate for the earth's marine and polar environments, His Serene Highness Prince Albert II of Monaco was honored for the prolific environmental work carried out by the Prince Albert II Foundation, which he founded in 2006 after traveling to the North Pole and witnessing the effects of climate change on the Arctic's weakening ice.

The Foundation has tackled a number of issues related to biodiversity, water security and energy efficiency. It took up the protection of the Bluefin tuna in 2008, and, as a result of its

efforts, a moratorium on the fish has been implemented in Monaco – the world's first 'Bluefin tuna free' country.

The joint winners of the 2nd category for Scientific and/or Technological Achievement in Environment are:

- Dr. Ashok Khosla (India), Founder of the Development Alternatives group (DA), whose mission is to help make national development strategies in India more environmentally and socially sustainable.

The Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation is dedicated to protecting the environment. It encourages sustainable and fair management of natural resources and places man at the centre of its projects. It supports the implementation of innovative and ethical solutions in three broad areas: climate change, water and biodiversity.

Since its inception, the Foundation has supported more than 127 sustainable and ethical projects focusing on climate in locations as diverse as the

Mediterranean Basin, Kenya, Mali, Indonesia and Brazil.

Among other issues, it has also supported projects related to developing renewable energies; combating the loss of biodiversity; improving universal access to clean water; and fighting desertification. In 2008, the Foundation took up the protection of the Bluefin tuna, and, as a result of its efforts, a moratorium on the fish has been implemented in Monaco – the world's first 'Bluefin tuna free' country.

Category II: Scientific and/or Technological Achievement in Environment - US\$300,000



DA's achievements include the introduction of more than 15 new environmentally sound and commercially viable technologies, such as machines for weaving handloom textiles, making recycled paper and fabricating low-cost roofing materials.

The organization is also known for the creation of more than 300,000 sustainable jobs in India.

The jury recognized Dr. Khosla's long-standing roles with UNEP, IUCN, the International Resource Panel, the International Institute for Sustainable Development, the World Bank and many other institutions.

Dr. Zakri Abdul Hamid

Dr. Hamid is a researcher, educator, administrator and diplomat spanning the science-policy interface.

The Zayed International Prize recognized his wideranging contributions to the environmental and sustainable development agendas, including his roles in the 2005 Millennium Ecosystem Assessment, the scientific subsidiary body of the Convention on Biological Diversity and the United Nations University Institute of Advanced Studies.

As co-Chair of the Millennium Ecosystem Assessment report - a ground-breaking study with over 2,000 individual authors - Dr. Hamid was instrumental in highlighting the need for the global community to take the necessary measures to alleviate our wanton destruction of ecosystem services if we are to meet the targets of the Millennium Development Goals.

Among the key findings of the report included the conclusion that humans have changed ecosystems more rapidly over the past 50 years than in any comparable period of human history.

Among other things, the milestone report found that approximately 20 per cent of the world's coral reefs were lost and an additional 20 per cent degraded in the last decades of the 20th century.

At the national level, Dr. Hamid has worked closely with Malaysia's Global Science and Innovation Advisory Council and the National Professors Council. In 2010, he was appointed Science Advisor to the Prime Minister of Malaysia.

Most recently, he was a founding Chair of the Intergovernmental Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) and a member of the UN Secretary General's Scientific Advisory Board.

Category III: Environmental Action Leading to Positive Change - US\$200,000


Through a joint proposal with the Government of Guatemala at Rio+20, Colombia noted that the SDGs "could provide a logical sequence and structure to the process launched almost 20 years ago" – at the first Rio Summit in 1992 – namely, the roadmap towards sustainable development.

In 2012, the proposal said, the scientific, environmental and political communities were better equipped to identify goals, gaps and needs to provide a more structured implementation of the principles defined in 1992. During the Rio+20 Summit, Gómez presented her country's "Dashboard" approach to sustainable development.

Through this concept, the post-2015 development agenda was designed around a "nucleus" of common global goals measured by a set of internationally agreed-on targets and indicators.

The global goals would also be



South-South cooperation could help usher in a Green Economy, says UNEP report



Zayed Foundation and UNEP release Arabic Version of Building Inclusive Green Economies, present real-life case studies from two dozen countries.

artnerships between countries in the South - in particular, those designed to promote more sustainable energy pathways - are sparking momentum for change across the developing world, according to a new report released in March 2014 for the first time in Arabic.

The Arabic version of Building Inclusive Green Economies: Success stories from South-South cooperation was released in Dubai by the Zayed International Foundation for the Environment and the United Nations Environment Programme

(UNEP), under the auspices of His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, United Arab Emirates Vice President, Prime Minister and Ruler of Dubai.

The report is the culmination of a landmark UNEP assessment of progress, initiatives, approaches, and tools for achieving a green economy in the context of sustainable development and poverty eradication.

It gathers data and success stories on green economy practices from 24 states engaged in South-South cooperation. From agriculture and energy to manufacturing and waste, countries reap benefits by sharing knowledge and experiences that could be replicated to put other developing countries on a more sustainable development pathway. The report highlights how partnerships between countries in the South to green key sectors have led to a myriad of projects and activities that are sparking new concepts, financing, technology, standards and momentum for change.

At the launch of the report in Dubai on 5th March, Achim

"UNEP is increasingly inspired by the global commitments from countries, as well as tangible examples of cooperation between governments and the private sector, to accelerate the transition to an inclusive, low-carbon green economy," he said.

economy in the context of sustainable development and poverty eradication.

"While the world is facing unprecedented population growth, greenhouse gas emissions and economic inequality that can challenge all nations but particularly developing countries and economies in transition, many of these countries are responding by establishing new alliances, bold strategies and innovative solutions that are enabling them to adapt and thrive in the 21st century," he said. Thanking the Government of the UAE for

hosting this important event, he also highlighted how it indicated the UAE's keenness to pursue a sustainable path.

Concluding his speech, Steiner noted that the report clearly shows that the next chapter of green development and green economy are being written in the South.

According to the 2012 market assessment, South and East Mediterranean countries represent more than 9 per cent of the world's solar thermal installed capacity, and could become a

frontrunner in the development of solar water heating and cooling technologies in several application areas.

The report underscores that investing in energy efficiency through cleaner production prevents waste and emissions, and assists companies in improving energy efficiency, reducing greenhouse gases emissions and cutting costs.

Case studies outlined in Building Inclusive Green economies:

Success stories from South-South cooperation describe successful experiences in fostering renewable energy, building ecosystems and greening agriculture and businesses.

Many of these success stories have taken place in the context of new market opportunities, in particular through BioTrade – economic activities derived from native biodiversity.

For example, the report describes the Blue Carbon Demonstration Project, hosted by the UAE, which is the first of its kind in the region. The project is studying the correlation between climate change and the storage of carbon in the ground beneath mangrove trees, seagrass meadows and saltwater marshlands.

The experience gained from the project will help to guide

other Blue Carbon projects and international efforts such as the Global Environment Facility's Blue Forests Project. It is also contributing to the production of new tools and methodologies, and enhancing blue carbon cooperation and training.

The results of this study are expected to be published later this year, and will be shared with decision makers responsible for protecting coastal ecosystems in the Emirates.

This report highlights how the partnerships between countries in the South are contributing to a global paradigm shift. It provides a snapshot of a myriad of projects and activities that are sparking new concepts,

The report highlights a host of initiatives that bear witness to the enormous potential in the South to contribute to the global development agenda.



financing, technology, standards and momentum for change.

The report shows how countries and other actors are pursuing initiatives to green key sectors of the economy – from agriculture and energy to manufacturing and waste – while sharing their knowledge and experiences with others, so they can also reap the benefits as well. More importantly, the experiences presented are being scaled-up and replicated, thus positioning other developing countries on a more sustainable development pathway.

In all of the examples presented in the report, one can see how enabling conditions play a role in their success. In Tunisia, an innovative financial mechanism has provided incentives for households to switch to solar-powered water heaters, and in Kenya the government's attractive feed-in-tariffs have encouraged key industries to become more energy efficient, while delivering energy to rural communities.

In another case, the impact of Vietnam's cleaner production centre has extended to not only small and medium enterprises there, but also in the neighbouring countries of Cambodia and Lao PDR. After providing training there, an extended network has been created that promotes resource efficiency and safer working conditions in the region.

Investing in the waste sector is

also critical for a green economy transition, as it can contribute to economic growth while addressing pro-poor issues linked to the environment. A related story in Uruguay depicts how a new national packaging law is being implemented, and how it is serving as good practice on waste management.

Another regional success story looks at the UNEP supported East African standard for organic produce. As a result of five countries working together, they have profited from new market access as well as significant environmental and social benefits. This initiative has now sparked interest in creating similar standards for the continent as well as in the Pacific region.



'UAE leads the way in transition to Green Economy'

In his welcome address, the UAE Minister of Environment and Water, Rashid Ahmed Bin Fahad, speaking on behalf of Sheikh Mohammad Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai said: "Empowered and informed consumers can more easily make changes in lifestyle and consumption patterns contributing to the

"The UAE started leading the way towards a Green Economy to create more diversified, resilient economy and achieve sustainable development," he added.

'Adopting a sustainable lifestyle entails accountability

and responsibility'

In his address at the opening ceremony held at the Mohammed Bin Rashid Hall of the Dubai Police Academy, Ibrahim Thiaw, Assistant Secretary-General of the United Nations and Deputy Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Program, thanked the Zayed Foundation for this initiative in supporting the cause of the environment.

"Shifting to more sustainable lifestyles is not only a 'label', found in UN jargon," said Mr. Thiaw. "It is about our daily lives: the buildings we live in, the shopping we do at

the mall, the food we have on our plates, the waste we generate, the clothes we wear and the light above our heads.

Khalifa Bin Zayed Al Nahyan."

The ultimate goal of this forum is to turn sustainability into a dominating culture, not only in buildings and cities, but covering all aspects of life including water, food and energy consumption, transport and entertainment, he pointed out.

postgraduate programmes in Green Economy through reference Foundation and UNEP, the to UNEP's approaches in the field and its extensive resources on the topic. We hope this initiative will provide relevant knowledge for university academics and curricula designers in the Arab Region looking into the potential for developing innovative new Green Economy programmes."

At the press conference, the Zayed Foundation also announced its decision to organize a Conference on Sustainable Lifestyles later this year in Dubai, United Arab Emirates (UAE).

Jointly organized by the Zayed objective of the conference is to emphasise how sustainable consumption and production patterns can influence consumers' individual behavior into becoming sustainable lifestyles and identify factors driving this behavioral change.

The conference will facilitate discussions soliciting views about the importance of dispersion of knowledge on the impact of our economic choices in order to change our behavior and consumption habits.





Putting the South on the Green Economy Track

There are still serious questions about responsibility and commitment regarding the fight against climate change, mainly due to inequities in global decision making. The inequity of regions, countries and specialties in global decision making is leading to insufficient procedures and unfair distribution of responsibility in agreements. This is further aggravated by weak coordination between countries and international organizations and between different sectors within counties.

Developing and underdeveloped countries are now waking up and seeking to shift to green development strategies with the help of developed countries in accordance with their historical responsibility. We were not optimistic about this until last year when a historical agreement was reached in Paris. The agreement is now signed by 191 Parties and ratified by 76 Parties

representing 60% of global emissions. We hope that implementation plans will be put into action immediately.

Developing and underdeveloped countries are seeking more diverse funding to finance green technology, renewable energy and efficient resource use. Actually more than 80% of country aid measures and strategic partnerships are mainly dealing with climate change challenges, including the spread of green values and practices among society, especially the younger generations. This requires heavy investment in green education and mass media communication in order to establish a culture of sustainable life styles.

One serious issue that needs to be addressed urgently is the bias of international funding agencies due to political agenda and diplomatic relations of the funding countries. More than 180 projects have been funded by the World Bank, for example, in Latin America and the Caribbean to cope with climate change totaling around 7.3 billion dollars, while there is nothing even close in Africa and the Middle East where there is little capacity to mitigate the impact of climate change, alleviate poverty, impact social equity or protect the environment.

We have to take all opportunities at the Global South-South Development EXPO 2016, which is being hosted by the UAE here in Dubai, to strengthen the bonds between countries of the South as a strong lobbying group that can positively affect the global decision-making mechanism in favor of their vital interests and towards combating climate change.

There are many success stories that can lead the way in developing countries. The UAE cared for the environment very early in its development path following an inherent practice of its visionary leaders, especially the late UAE Father, Sheikh Zayed Bin Sultan Al Nahyan. I have personnaly witnessed the incredible development boom in infrastructure and urbanization of the UAE during the last 19 years, particularly the unprecedented care for environment and sustainability, that has been evident in the last decade. The UAE Green Development Strategy is now underway to achieve the UAE Vision 2021.

I have come to believe that leadership is the key to achieving sustainable development and saving Mother Earth. The vision and determination of the UAE leaders were vital for putting the development train of this nation on the Green Economy track.
